Introduction

In accordance with the Wisconsin Valley Library Service 2016 System Plan, WVLS will provide in-service training for participating public library personnel and trustees and professional consultation services to participating public libraries. WVLS will sponsor or co-sponsor a minimum of thirty-six (36) contact hours of which at least twelve (12) are provided in-person at a location within a reasonable driving distance.¹

All continuing education opportunities are planned in accordance with the requirements set forth in the *Certification Manual for Wisconsin Public Library Directors* published by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, Division for Libraries and Technology.²

WVLS provides continuing education for library staff, administration, and trustees of twenty-five (25) member libraries. Fifteen (15) of the member libraries have a service population under 5,000, four (4) serve between 5,000-10,000, three (3) serve between 10,000 and 20,000 patrons, and three (3) serve over 20,000 patrons. This disparity in service population outlines the need for a variety and adaptability of continuing education opportunities. Library staff, administration, and trustees and those of neighboring systems are invited to continuing education opportunities not specific to WVLS member libraries.

The Survey

WVLS distributed the 2017 Continuing Education Survey via email and the WVLS Facebook page on Wednesday July 13, 2016. Twenty-eight (28) responses were submitted with eighteen (18) libraries represented before the survey closed Friday July 22, 2016. Multiple responses were received from Rhinelander, Demmer Memorial Library, and Marathon County Public Library branches and staff members.

There were seventeen (17) questions including five (5) open-ended responses. Participants specified their interest in workshop topics using a three tiered rating range: Very Interested, Sort of Interested, or Not Interested.

Key Summary Notes

- 14 responses from Public Library Directors
- 14 responses from Public Library Staff Members
- 16 responses indicated they would be willing to drive to a workshop 26-50 miles one way.
- An additional 10 responses indicated they would drive to workshops 51-100+ miles one way.
- 23 responses indicated they would be willing to drive farther to workshops if WVLS provided mileage reimbursement.
