

Are You Being Served? Programming for Emerging Adults

Adult library programming: three words that can strike terror into the hearts of many librarians. But check out the census statistics and you will likely discover that 30–40% of your community is between 20 and 40 years of age. However, if you examine your programs, chances are you'll find you have plenty of programs for babies through teens and seniors — but what happens to the middle group?

The creators of Alt Library, Jessica Jupitus and Lori Easterwood, share their tips for designing programs for the 20s and 30s crowd. Alt Library is a programming initiative of the Sacramento Public Library designed to engage community members in their 20s and 30s with fun and provocative programming. The program has been going strong for 7 years with a blog, meetup group, and media coverage galore.
